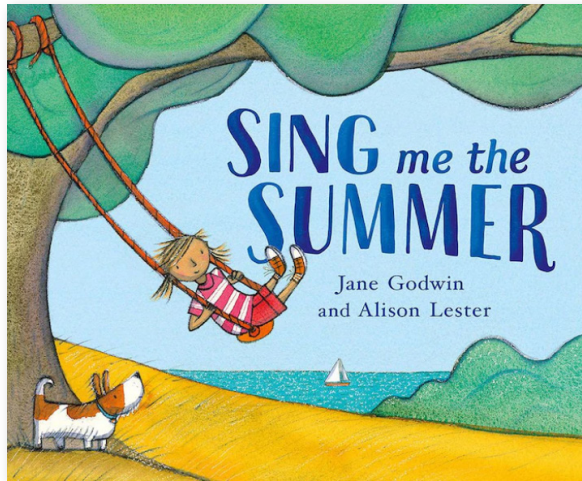


SunSmart Literature Activity Sheet.

A lyrical rhyming text about the distinct joys that each season brings. The book cherishes family togetherness in the natural world and the small moments outside that often become our lasting memories of childhood.

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Count!

Count how many children are in the story?

Day & Night Art

Fold a piece of A3 paper in half, then open the paper flat. Using a lead pencil only, draw a picture of the front cover. On one side of the folded line, colour the picture to show day and the other half to show night.

Calendars

The story starts in summer and ends in summer. Using the labelled cards on page two, order the months from January to December. Sort the months into seasons and your local Aboriginal seasons.

SunSmart Spot

Look at the pictures throughout the story. Can you spot any slip, slop, slap, seek and slide in the pictures?

Five Senses

Use your five senses and go on a seasons hunt (depending on time of year). Look for items that tell you that it is summer, autumn, winter or spring.

Dress Ups for the Seasons

Role play and dress up in different clothing that you would wear throughout the seasons or local Aboriginal seasons.

Dramatic Play-Day at the Beach
